English

Recently in English, Year 2 completed a Video Project in English class. Each student was encouraged to write their own 'weather report', practice reading it out loud, and then present it on camera.

This is a fun way to encourage students to be creative with their English writing as well as making them feel connected to the world around them.

• In English this week, Year 6 learners read and discussed about how areas of our oceans are becoming damaged by plastic pollution, and they also discussed ways of reducing people's use of plastic.





Maths

In KS1, Year 1 Blue and Yellow have joined forces in Maths to explore rotating shapes and objects! This challenging topic involves plenty of practical, hands-on activities to help students visualize how objects look as they turn. While this concept will play a bigger role in geometry in later years, for now, the focus is on recognizing how shapes appear before and after a rotation. The students have been working hard and having fun with this important foundational skill.







In KS2, Year 4 has been busy exploring perimeter and area in Maths. Students started by learning how to calculate the perimeter of different shapes and measure the area using square units. To make their learning more interactive, they worked on hands-on activities, such as measuring the classroom objects. These activities helped them see how perimeter and area are applied in real-life scenarios.





Science

In KS1, Year 2 carefully observed the moths and discussed the differences between moths and butterflies, noting details like their antennae and resting positions. They even had the chance to gently handle the moths before releasing them back into the wild. This hands-on experience brought their learning to life, helping them understand science in a real and meaningful way.







In KS2, Year 5 has been diving into the science of food by learning how to create recipes for their favorite dishes! As part of wrapping up our Food unit, students researched ingredients, designed unique menus for their imaginary restaurants, and crafted colorful recipe posters to showcase their creativity. For the grand finale, Yiwa's mum joined us to teach the class how to make a delicious papaya salad. The students had a blast learning the steps and trying their hand at preparing the dish. What a tasty and engaging way to celebrate their hard work and creativity!

Thai Language

EYFS: Navigating through the letter 'Ń maze ⁽⁶⁾ Learning Thai letters and new words while having fun with markers.



KS1: Students are learning the letter ň and putting their creativity to work by designing bees based on their imagination. It's a fun and engaging way to connect language and art while practicing new sounds! •••

KS2: A classroom activity focused on Thai sentence structure: Subject, Verb, and Object. The teacher drew fun, imaginative illustrations, and the students were tasked with creating sentences that matched the pictures using proper Thai grammar. The students loved the creative drawings and eagerly participated in the activity!





Thai Culture





EYF: Learning about "I-" and national flags with creativity. The children made the Thai flag beautifully a showing great effort.





KS1: Thai culture class, the teacher guided the children to practice writing their full names, including the correct use of honorifics. The students eagerly wrote their names on paper, enjoying the activity and feeling proud of their achievements.





KS2: In the Thai Language class, students learned to compose *klon si* (ĆṬŹŃü��a traditional four-line poem. The lesson began with an overview of Thai poetry history, followed by a hands-on activity where students practiced writing their own *klon si*. This activity enhanced their language skills and appreciation for Thai cultural heritage.

Chinese Language

EYFS'S classrooms buzzed with excitement as students eagerly embraced new interactive learning experiences. Through various games, students learned and practiced how to use Chinese new words "有(yǒu),have " and "没有(méi yǒu),don't have" as well as Chinese numbers "十一(shí yī),eleven " to "二十(èr shí)",twenty" We also provided Pre-Nursery children with more opportunities to learn Chinese new words by reading Chinese picture books, laying a foundation for their next step of listening and speaking learning.

In the last two weeks, KS 1 have been focusing on Pinyin拼音 learning and reviewing. Year 1 students learn to recognize Chinese characters 有(have),没有(don't have),家 (home),几 (how many),人 (people),etc. Year 2 students learned the names of different rooms and the classifier of rooms; Year 3 students learned the names of different areas in school.

KS 2 students having been working hard to improve their oral expressions and their efforts are paying off. The students have learned and practiced more words about clothes and outfit: "毛衣-sweater,帽子-hat,大衣-coat,围巾-scarf" and so on. They practiced this words by using them in simple sentences "这是帽子(This is a hat),这是手套(This is a glove)…..". The children also drew and coloured a picture of a man in class and dressed him in the clothes they like. Some children dressed the little figures in winter clothes, some in summer clothes, and then practiced introducing their designs in Chinese.
